I was reflecting back on my own past piano studies with various teachers over the years. I started lessons with my next-door neighbor, Karen Gookin, then moved on to Dorothy Munz when Karen moved away. In college I studied with Victor Steinhardt at the U of O School of Music.

There was that time he (rightfully) sent me away to practice when I was woefully unprepared for a lesson. An important lesson in itself.

There was the time I told him I didn't feel he was pushing me hard enough. He asked what I thought he should be telling me to do. I outlined some things I thought he should be assigning me. He then said, "Well, go do that." Lesson learned: I shouldn't need others to set my goals. Determine what I want out of music, then go do it. One of the best lessons he ever gave me.

Then there was that one day we both had questions about why we do this thing called music. The competition, the stress, the bad opinions of others.

So we spent the entire lesson talking. Why do we play? Why do we study? What is the goal? What is the actual point? Is it for the competitions? Is competition bad? What motivates us?

Deep stuff, and deeply impacting for this young kid figuring out what was coming after graduation. When I think of my studies with Victor, I could think of his excellent instruction in technique, artistry, performance, repertoire, interpretation, etc. All of these were vital and central to my time studying with him, and I am, of course, eternally grateful for them.

But instead, I remember that one lesson more than anything.

Thank you, Victor.

Be encouraged. Love your students well. Keep making music together!

Eugene District Syllabus Final Report

Number of teachers participating: 23

Number of students registered: 124

Number of adjudication days (schedules): 13 (including 4 part days)

Summary:

Eugene District had 9 full days and 4 part days of adjudication. For Spring of 2018, we will request an additional adjudicator and plan for 9-10 full days of adjudication.

There were 3 problems that arose with this Springs Syllabus:

1. Teachers not observing the deadline date for their payments. That problem is being addressed by a letter to teachers as well as an update to the District web-site requesting that teachers observe the deadlines for the student events.
2. Not having enough studios offered. We did receive permission for 4 days of syllabus using Claire and Dean's offices at the UO, but that was not finalized until a week before syllabus. For 2018, we will request that teachers entering a 1/2 day or more of students to please offer their studios for Syllabus. We may not always need all the studios, but we need the option of having them. We may not always be able to have access to the UO studios because of faculty use.
3. The use of photocopied music. The Syllabus manual states clearly that the use of photocopied music is not allowed. Adjudicators may ask a student to remove photocopied music from the adjudication area. If a student is playing from an unauthorized photocopy, the Adjudicator may refuse to hear that piece(s). This issue will probably need to be addressed continually.
