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

Eugene District Junior Baroque Festival, Final Report

Date event held: Sunday, February 12, 2017 Place: Unity of the Valley, 3912 Dillard Rd, Eugene, OR 97405

On Sunday February 12, 2017, the OMTA Eugene District held its Junior Bach Festival. Twentysix students representing eight studios participated in two recitals (2:00 pm and at 3:30 pm.) These young pianists offered wonderful performances of Baroque music, and we had a good variety of repertoire. Our two adjudicators, Crystal Zimmerman and Heidi Evans, chose winners from each of the four divisions to perform at the state festival in accordance with the 30% rule based on the number of entries for each Division in the District Festival.

In view of this deficit, let's note that one teacher had to cancel the registration of four students, due to health and family challenges. If these students had participated as planned, the deficit would have been of \$7.55. Also, I took the chair responsibility for this event a little by surprise last September, and I completely failed the advertising part of the chair responsibilities (Con Brio articles especially.). Some remarks were made about the registration cost being high, and having the same adjudicators returning so soon. I realize that both Heidi and Crystal adjudicated in 2015.
