I've had to change how I teach, adding information about chords and inversions, blues scales and lead sheets far earlier than I usually do. He's soaking it up and hungry for more.

I was wrong about him. And I'm so glad I was wrong. (I do wish that when I was a kid, I looked as cool as he does, though. Too late, I guess...)
