I am proud to announce that the Eugene District of the Oregon Music Teachers Association in partnership with the Oregon Community Foundation and the Nellie Tholen Fund will present "Baroque Dance Rhythms" on Monday, November 12th from 10:15-11:30 am. This very special program is of interest to pianists, music teachers of all instruments and is free and open to the general public; no pre-registration or membership is required.



About the Program

Daniel Stephens and Judith Kennedy will examine Baroque dance music through the medium of steps, patterns and dances from the period. The intent is to inform the playing and teaching of music based on such dances as the Minuet, Passepied, Gavotte, Bourée, Sarabande and Courante.

About the presenters Daniel Stephens and Judith Kennedy

Daniel Stephens earned a BA in Theater at Southern Oregon University, and his MFA in Dance at SMU. He was a member of the company of the Oregon Shakespeare Festival for many years, where he performed historic dance in the Green Show, and danced and acted in various plays on their stages for which he also did choreography.

Judith Kennedy received her BA in Dance and her MA in Dance History at Mills College. She was the choreographer for the Oregon Shakespeare Festival Green Show for twenty-five years, and also taught extensively for their Institute of Renaissance Studies.

On October 8th, at our monthly OMTA gathering, we were fortunate to have OMTA President Selena Manson as our guest speaker. Her lecture focused on the MTNA website and the enormous amount of useful information available to members. It was truly eyeopening as she walked



us through the many areas on the website, realizing that I personally have been neglectful to explore this treasure trove. It is worth spending time traveling through the many topics familiarizing ourselves with its contents. The list is too long to enumerate and the wide range of topics covered is impressive.



One particularly new offering that is very exciting is the "MTNA eFestival". It is an on-line festival for performing and is available for a wide range of instruments, not just piano. A total of 15 minutes of video taping of a student OR teacher performing ANY literature is allowed. There is no deadline when the video may be sent. A highly qualified adjudicator evaluates the performance,

critiques the playing and responds within 10 days. The fee is \$60.00 per video. A certificate of accomplishment can be requested upon completion. Please check it out. In summary, this website is invaluable and easily accessible if you create an account. Thank you, Selina!

MINUTES

Eugene District OMTA • General Meeting Monday, October 8, 2018 • First Congregational Church, Eugene

President Mason called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m.

Roll call was taken via the sign-in sheet.

The minutes from the September meeting were approved by general assent.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer audit was done last week by President Mason and Secretary Rieser. It covered the last two years of expenditures and receipts. Treasurer reports are distributed via *Con Brio*.

Committee Reports

<u>Membership</u>: (President Mason is acting chair): Our new members are Kara Ewbank and Wyatt True. Both are involved with teaching string instruments.

President Mason proposed we remove teachers from the district directory who have not renewed for the last three years, and there was general agreement that this is OK to do. All members: please check your information listed there to make sure it's updated and let President Mason know if it's not.

Non-member event fees. Some attendees mentioned that there is an issue with our non-member fee policy – it isn't clear and it varies by event. Each district is allowed to decide its own policy. Due to lack of time, this issue was put aside for future discussion.

<u>Publicity</u>: (Alexis Gibbons) Our web site is now largely converted from the old site to the new one. Secretary Rieser expressed thanks to Alexis Gibbons for her hard work on that. There are some kinks to be worked out. For example the name of event chairs and other important contacts may not be linked to their correct emails. For this or broken links, or references to the old web site, please let Secretary Rieser know (ncrieser@gmail.com) not President Mason as *Con Brio* stated.

Issue of reaching college students: At the state board meeting, President Mason was reminded that OMTA is not well known in many colleges, and that each district should plan college student outreach. She suggested we do outreach at U of O, Northwest Christian College, and LCC. Secretary Gibbons said there are grants for teachers who have been teaching for under three years. [Secretary Rieser's note: information about this can be found at this link: https://www.mtnafoundation.org/mtna-grants/.] For collegiate members, if they join MTNA, they are automatically OMTA members which means they can participate in our events.

President Mason said Cindy Peterson, the Northwest MTNA chair, is sending material to each district to help with outreach to college students. Vice-President Pollack suggested that we need a poster. President Mason showed one of the past OMTA brochures. Sandy Hull has several of them. There was some agreement that we need some material that is appealing to the new generation. Ellen McQuilkin and Sandy Hull volunteered to form a strategy group with President Mason to work on this.

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Clavier Companion: please get your check to Jean Wilson soon. It looks like we have enough participants. The subscription runs January through December and includes online access.

<u>Festival of Popular Music</u>: The deadline is this Friday (October 12). So far, we have enough entrants for 1½ recitals.

<u>Sonatina Festival</u> (October 27). We are somewhat down in number (63 now vs. 80 last year). Sandy Hull said that the repertoire list is published in January in connection with state OMTA publications. President Mason said this announcement should be in *Con Brio* as our main means of communication important information. Fern McArthur would like to retire as chair. Please speak up if you would like to replace her. Volunteers are still needed!


