### The 2019 Beverly Soule Award Competition.


The Beverly Soule Scholarship Auditions took place on Sunday, April 28th. This competition is open to high school juniors and seniors to "encourage and reward deserving high school students...whether or not the applicant intends to continue music studies after graduation (Beverly Soule)." The winner receives an award of \$700, second winner receives \$200 and third winner receives \$150.

We had five participating students this year. Each contestant played three memorized pieces representing different style periods. The 2019 winner is Teresa Padilla, student of Winifred Kerner, the second winner is Levi Brown, student of Genevieve Mason, and the third winner is Anzo DeGiulio, student of Ellen McQuilkin. Kate Vu and Nathaniel Mason (students of Lucy Clevenger and Genevieve Mason) received Honorable Mentions.

The winners will perform at the Music Teacher Showcase Recital on Saturday, May 18, 2019. The first prize winner, Teresa Padilla, is invited to play her entire program and receive the award. Levi Brown and Anzo DeGiulio are invited to perform one selection from the program. Congratulations to the students and teachers!

## MINUTES Eugene District OMTA • General Meeting Monday, April 8, 2019 • Home of Betsy Parker and Victor Steinhart

President Mason called the meeting to order at 9:47 am.

The March minutes were approved by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: We have a surplus - the main account is around \$11,800. President Mason would like to start a teacher scholarship fund for attending conferences and would like to use some of the surplus for that. Scholarships would go to very involved teachers - a discussion took place about how to quantify volunteer hours to determine who would deserve the scholarship; no vote was taken. Another idea for the surplus would be to increase student scholarships.

#### Student Activities

<u>Ensemble</u> Festival: The fee for the festival is now \$10 but that was set when we had high fees for the UO venue rental. The cost will be lower now if we do it at Unity of the Valley.

<u>Composition Celebration:</u> This went well. Gibbons brought up ongoing parent complaints that the event is sometimes not student-centered. Last year the adjudicator had an activity where students played a part of their piece, which seemed good, but this year there were complaints that there was too much of the adjudicator's music at the start. She will mention this to Paul Safar. General sense that a workshop for works in progress would be good; we should put it on our schedule.

<u>Contemporary Music Festival:</u> this is next week. Discussion followed re: putting the Classic Piano logo on the program; response was positive. Neil Patton is working on a recital program template, which would be available for later events.

Beverly Soule Scholarship: Audition registration is still open, even though the deadline was 4/5/19.

<u>Teacher Showcase/Soule Scholarship Recital:</u> Only four teachers have signed up; we need more teachers if the recital is to happen. Betsy Parker will be happy to accompany performers. She has offered her studio for rehearsals.

#### **Announcements**

The OMTA state conference is in Eugene, on the UO campus, from 8/21-24/19.

May meeting: the brunch is at Valley River Inn on May 13 at 9:00. It's \$15. Make checks payable to "Eugene OMTA" and send to Janet Pollack beforehand or give to her at the event.

#### Unfinished business

Next year's schedule – President Mason is thinking of having committees run events, especially the adjudicated ones: Ensemble, Baroque, and Composition. The committee would consist of an event chair, a Leggiero chair, and a festival host. This would make the preparation easier and more likely to generate interest. Event chair training will be improved, and the responsibilities will be covered in a video or written up on our website.

President Mason adjourned the meeting at 10:16 am.

Ryan recently debuted a set of cello and piano miniatures for Off The Hook Arts Winterfest 2019, and is currently recording his sixth solo piano album. He maintains a full piano studio and is in frequent demand as a guest choral conductor and accompanist.
