Fall Syllabus, Eugene District 2020

As with all our other student activities this fall, Syllabus will be on-line. It is very important that teachers planning to place students in Fall Syllabus read and follow this list of Syllabus Protocols. Registration will be through Leggerio and it is very important that you attach a note to me on your Syllabus invoice regarding any additional special circumstances for your students.

Registration in early September and close it by October 23 to allow extra time for scheduling. Payment for syllabus must be received by Monday, October 26. The State Syllabus Committee has stated that payment must be received by the chair before students can be scheduled. With the USPS mail situation as it currently is, please put your checks in the mail early.

Syllabus Virtual Exam Protocols for Teachers and District Chairs 2020 Fall, Classical Piano Syllabus (2021 Spring TBD)

For Teachers (Fall 2020)

- Students may be tested from the teacher's studio or from their own homes.
- Register students in Leggiero. In the "Special Circumstances" box, make a note of what platform(s) your students have available for testing. (Zoom, Google, FaceTime, Skype, etc)
- Teacher Conferences are still required.
- Contact your adjudicator as soon as your schedule is published, with platform information for all testing sites for your students (your studio/their home) such as FaceTime numbers, Skype/Zoom addresses, etc.
- A PDF of the repertoire must be sent a minimum of two days ahead of exams to the adjudicator via email/Dropbox/Google Docs. (With measure numbers, no photocopies...)
- Remind families to turn off all streaming devices during the exams, and to keep family/ pets out of the room.
- Work with your students at announcing the progressions clearly and loudly to compensate for the sound of the piano online.
- Students in Levels 1-5 should take the entire test live.
- Students in Levels 6-10 may choose to record their repertoire rather than playing live. All
 repertoire selections should be sent in ONE video file to the adjudicator a minimum of two
 days before the exam via YouTube link, Google drive link, or Dropbox.
- The adjudicator will initiate the exam when they are ready for the next student.
- Absolutely no video recordings may be taken of Syllabus exams by the teacher or student's family, or by the adjudicator.
- After the exam, the adjudicator will send an email/text with the results directly to the teacher, who will forward them to the student.
- Certificate and paper copy of the comments sheet will be USPS mailed to the teacher after the exams.
- If the live connection fails or is not possible due to technology constraints, the adjudicator may send an email or text indicating which skills/keys will be tested. The student should video themselves performing those particular skills for a non-linear exam. The video link will be sent to the adjudicator as referenced above.

Eugene District OMTA * General Meeting Monday, September 14, 2020 Zoom Meeting

President MASON called the meeting to order at 9:04 am.

The agenda included:

- -Treasurer's Report

- -Colleagues impacted by the fires Carol White discussed
- -New business: Nobuko is the new Teacher Referral Chair

Presentation: Sarah Ball, new State OMTA President, gave a wonderful presentation following the business meeting entitled: How Do Children Learn.

The minutes from the June meeting were approved.

Genevieve will contact new members.

Carol White discussed how to help OMTA colleages impacted by the fires including Katie Caulley in Blue River. Carol will look into how OMTA can donate materials to teachers and/or students.

Liz Willis is looking into how the State OMTA can facilitate donations for Oregon OMTA teachers.

Paul Safar will ask Katie for a list of donation items needed and email the membership.

Red Cross was suggested as a central donation entity.

After a discussion of the budget, Genevieve proposed that the Eugene District OMTA donate \$200 to the Red Cross and will email Cheri Richardson with the Red Cross address. A vote was taken, and all were in favor.

Andrew Pham attended to announce his new Piano Forum project which is being held via zoom and offers an online studio-style class with opportunities for advanced and intermediate level students to perform pieces or sections of pieces in progress in an informal setting, provide peer feedback, and receive input from Andrew Pham. In future he may host guest speakers and clinicians. His Forum offers an exciting opportunity for piano students who typically are not able to interact with other students from different studios outside of recitals.

Genevieve discussed and demonstrated the updated website:

- -The teacher directory is listed under teacher resources. Teachers are reminded to update their teacher page.
- -The Schedule of Student Activities is listed under Student Resources.

Online Recitals this year:

- -All student activities will be pre-recorded and held virtually via zoom.
- -Over Winter Break, it will be reviewed as to whether any subsequent recitals will be held in person.
- -The Student Activity Committee carefully put together new guidelines for submitting student performances for the virtual recitals.
- -Teachers are reminded to read and follow the new guidelines closely.
- -Online recital chairs must have a Photo/Video Release Form. Each student should sign this form at the beginning of the year and mail or scan it to their teacher. The teacher can then make a copy of the signed form to submit for each recital. This form cannot be filled out on the website. The chairs must have a hard copy.
- -Recital forms are to be submitted by the teacher to the Recital Chair.
- -Videos are made by the student and sent to their individual teacher. The teacher teacher then submits the videos to Neil via email.
- -Highlights of video guidelines: (Please read full guidelines on website)
 - -Videos can be made early.
 - -Students should wear recital dress.
 - -Students should NOT announce their piece.
- -Please pay careful attention to the **two deadlines** per student activity. The chair has only one week to create the program. Neil has only week to create the iMovie Recital.
- -Neil made a video explaining the process to teachers. Genevieve will send that to us.

- -Will be held on Sunday, November 1st at 2:00.
- -Please note there are **two** separate submittals:
 - -The forms submitted to Wyatt due Friday, October 16th.
