Eugene District Fall Syllabus: Final Report November 7 & 8, 2020

Income: \$909.00 fees which was forwarded to State Syllabus.

Eugene District successfully held our on-line Syllabus Evaluations on Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 7 & 8. We had 23 students representing 7 studios participating this fall. This gave us a partial day on Saturday and 2 full schedules on Sunday.

We had 2 Level 10 students participate this fall: Irvania Lopez-Toledo (student of Pat Morse) and Aisha Brundan (student of Genevieve Mason). Congratulations to those students and their teachers!

Notes for Spring Syllabus:

- 1. I will order Certificates early this time so they can be included in the packets sent to the Adjudicators.
- 2. Scheduling requires a 5 minute break between students and conferences to allow the adjudicator time to organize paperwork and switch platforms when necessary. This Fall Syllabus was easy because of the smaller amount of students participating. Anticipating a larger group of students for Spring, it will be necessary to have an earlier cut-off date for entries. Teachers should start planning their Spring Syllabus soon after the first of the year.
- 3. How to send pdf's of the student music to the Adjudicators was a bit of a difficulty. Perhaps we (I) should add extra information in the Con Brio regarding how to send pdf's and student videos to the Adjudicators.

Beautiful Steinway for Sale

Retired OMTA member Carol Hawn is selling her 1967 Steinway B semi-concert grand piano. Due to her genetic hearing loss, she is no longer able to use it nor enjoy it. This is a low-mileage grand, with a beautiful action and excellent tone. It is ebony, and was purchased in Salem in 1967 from the Stone Piano Co. (Serial Number 394812). Tuned three times yearly until recently, with a tight pin-block, and regulated in 2006 by Carl Freeman, a tuner who trained and worked at the Steinway factory in New York in the 1930s.

Carol has a Master of Music in Piano Performance from the University of Michigan. She taught for twenty years in her home studio, though students played on another instrument. Thus, this piano has only been under Carol's hands and care for the duration. She can be reached at 541-744-3197 for inquiries and pricing.

New Music Book from Neil Patton

Neil has just released a new folio of sheet music for his critically acclaimed 2018 album, Solitaire. This is a collection of 15 contemporary solo piano pieces, ranging in style from new age to classical, folk and rock. Syllabus difficulty levels range from Level VI to X.



The book contains not only over 80 pages of music (transcribed by the author), but also 10 pages of extensive notes about the background of each piece, and pedagogical notes to help with the preparation and performance of the included works. There are also difficulty rankings based on the OMTA Syllabus repertoire lists, to help choose appropriate pieces for students' skill levels.
