Eugene District held successful Spring Syllabus evaluations with a combination of in-person and on-line exams. Our on-line days consisted of a part day on Saturday plus 2 students scheduled earlier in the week due to complications in scheduling for the weekend. Our Friday in-person day was a little short due to working with the church where the Syllabus was held. All the other Saturday and Sunday in-person schedules were full.

The majority of students and teachers chose in-person exams; however, having the option of on-line exams is very valuable for students, families, teachers and the Chair when unexpected illness or scheduling conflicts arise. I hope this option for Syllabus will be continued post-pandemic.

Minutes May 11, 2022

Meeting began at 9:05 am in the small conference room in Berwick on the campus of the University of Oregon.

Six members attended the business meeting: Alexis (with Iris in tow), Nick, Genevieve, Janet and Lucy.

Committee Reports

Composition Celebration took place at United Lutheran Church. Nick, co-chair, declared it a success, with six participants and Daniel Vega adjudicating. The term "Small but Mighty" was used to characterize the event. It was proposed that next year the required project would be composing a film score rather than an independent piece.

Beverly Soule Scholarship. Lucy Clevenger, chair of the event, informed members that there were four registered students and that entry was now closed. The auditions will take place Sunday, April 24th at Lucy's Studio. It was noted that students who win will be expected to make a video to be shown at the Teacher Showcase.

Teacher Showcase / Scholarship. The showcase is scheduled for May 14th online with videos pre-recorded. The video is due on May 6th; Neil is hired to assemble the videos into a coherent concert. Since this is an online fundraiser this year, the question of how to publicize the event was raised. Suggestions ranged from putting an ad on our local public radio station to posters placed in area music venues to placing an announcement in the Register Guard (in print or online version?). There was also the question of how the public would be able to donate to OMTA during and/or immediately after the concert. It was determined that Wyatt will deal with establishing the format for folks to donate online.

The University of Oregon Piano Festival is new and intended to be a yearly event. The deadline to register has been extended to April 18th.

Additional Business

Members were reminded that the OMTA State Conference is in Florence, OR this year, Thursday-Friday June 23-24th. It will be a hybrid event for those who cannot attend in person.

Additional opportunities for fundraiser events were briefly discussed. Such events as member/student concerts at Valley Center and/or Gateway Malls and/or The Jazz Station were mentioned as possible sites for fundraising concerts.

Lucy proposed raising student entry fees from \$10-\$15.00, pointing out that the current fee had been in place for a number of years and that the cost of venues and adjudicators has increased. Further discussion is necessary.

Genevieve suggested that *Leggiero* needs to be altered to allow additional information to be placed on programs. Members find it too rigid and limiting.

In passing, it was mentioned that packets for hosting Syllabus have been delivered.

The intent of the May meeting is to celebrate the year, thank the outgoing board and to vote and welcome the incoming one.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 am.
