I hope to see you all this coming Monday for our first business meeting and program of the year! Don't forget it's at Berwick (see above).



Discussion includes helping students find cadences, establish phrasing and articulation, and how to translate Baroque musical idioms on the harpsichord and the piano.

Eugene District Syllabus Information

Syllabus Exams starting Fall 2022 will be primarily in-person with masking optional, following the CDC guidelines as well as the Oregon Health Authority for more localized information.

Please note: Eugene Fall Syllabus will be <u>November 11 - 13 (Friday - Sunday</u>). The Fall <u>regis-</u> <u>tration deadline is October 14</u>. Please be sure to observe the registration deadline. We will be in need of studios for Syllabus; typically, we will need at least 1 studio on Friday, 3 - 4 studios on Saturday and 2 studios on Sunday.

There will be a state-wide Virtual Syllabus weekend (November 18-20) for any students who absolutely cannot attend the in-person exam (e.g. the student lives out of state). Both Virtual and inperson Syllabus will include Rhythm and Sight Reading. As in previous years, PDFs and video links are due four days (Mon/Tues) before the scheduled Virtual Syllabus dates. See forms on State Website under Syllabus for instructions on making PDFs and video links.

Syllabus fees have been raised starting this fall to cover increases in hotel reimbusements and adjudicator pay raises. The new fee schedule is posted on the State Web-page under Syllabus.

Teacher attendance and teacher conference is required for both in-person and virtual exams. In the next Syllabus update, it will state teachers should have a conference for each scheduled day of their studio. For a full 7 hour day, it will be recommended that teachers have a morning and afternoon conference.
