The Festival of Popular Music took place at 2 pm on Sunday, October 23rd, at the United Lutheran Church. Six teachers and thirteen students participated in the festival's one 45-minute program.

The student performances included ensemble and vocal pieces, folk music, movie and video game themes, as well as jazz and blues by composers such as Kevin Olson, Martha Mier, Hale Smith, and Scott Joplin. Handsomely dressed performers (a few in costumes) added to the warm and entertaining atmosphere. Dora Zhou, Genevieve Mason (voice), and Betsy Parker Steinhardt (tambourine) participated in performances with their students. The students' playing demonstrated fine preparation and sparkling musicality.

The recital was enthusiastically received by a large audience of family and friends, many of whom expressed appreciation. Before leaving, one kind gentleman thanked me for the event with tears in his eyes. He commented that events such as ours provided a much-needed sense of "social cohesion". I was moved, and I told him I would pass that message along to all OMTA members.

The total of fees collected was \$195. The venue cost was \$150, leaving us with a net profit of \$45.



# MINUTES Eugene District OMTA \* General Meeting September 19, 2022

President Rieser called the meeting to order at 9:30 am.

Attendees: Dawn DeMars, Tung Nguyen, Alexis Gibbons, Kumiko Vanderbush, Juan Avendano, Kami Hendrix, Genevieve Mason, Paul Safar, Sandy Hull, Grace Ho, Nick Rieser, Soria Phillips-Meadow

Nick welcomed everyone to the 2022-23 season as new Eugene OMTA President and introduced our OMTA group to the four new members in attendance. He gave a brief overview of his teaching focus and encouraged the new teachers to share their specializations with the group so that we can all help refer students accordingly.

Nick introduced Grace Ho as our new Eugene OMTA Vice President and thanked her for her work in lining up a full year of wonderful programs for our District. He also thanked Genevieve Mason for all of her work as President and for seeing us through the challenging last few years during the Pandemic.

Grace gave an overview of this year's programs and noted that meetings are usually scheduled for the 2nd Monday of the month, but that this and the March meeting are scheduled for the 3rd Monday of the month. She introduced the year's programs as follows:

## Monday, October 10 in Berwick Hall at the UO School of Music and Dance (UO SOMD):

Dr. Lark Powers will present "The Creativity of the Baroque Repertoire" featuring a wide range of composers and levels and will demonstrate on both harpsichord and piano. This presentation is sponsored by the Oregon Community Foundation. Parking will be now be available at an hourly rate directly behind the UO SOMD (to the east) and parking may be reimbursed.

Monday, November 14 Zoom Presentation with an in-person gathering for viewing together on a large screen at First Congregational Church at 1050 E. 23rd in Eugene: Dr. Scott Price of South Carolina School of Music will present "Adaptive Teaching for Neurodiverse Students" offering ways to adapt pedagogy accordingly.

Monday, December 12: Holiday Potluck – place and time TBD.

Monday, January 16 (\*this is the 3rd Monday of the month) at First Congregational Church: Dr. Crystal Zimmerman of Willamette University will present "Late Elementary and Early Intermediate Music by Women Composers."

**Monday, February 13 Zoom Presentation:** Dr. Laura Chu Stokes will offer ways to engage students when they haven't practiced in her presentation entitled "Turning Lemons into Lemonade: Ideas on Productive Lessons When Your Students Haven't Practiced."

Monday, March 13 in Berwick Hall at the UO SOMD: Martha Hilley, immediate past President of MTNA and retired Professor of Pedagogy at University of Texas at Austin, presents "Are you and your students getting Full Value out of the repertoire?"

**Monday, April 10 at First Congregational Church:** Dr. Alexandre Dossin will present "The Piano Music of George Walker", the first African American to win the Pulitzer Prize for Music.

**Monday, May 8:** Mr. Martin Garcia Garcia will give a Masterclass for advanced students to be held at the UO. \*On May 7, he will also give a concert in Corvallis.

Monday, June 12: Annual spring Potluck, time and place TBD.

Nick thanked Grace for her work to secure grants toward some of these presentations.

### Announcements including new Committee Chairs and explanation of procedures for new members:

The Treasurer's Report and Minutes will be published in the Con Brio.

Sarah Rose introduced herself as our new Eugene District Treasurer. We have a balance of \$4,293 in checking and a scholarship account balance of \$10,415.

The State Composition Virtual Recital video recording will be on the OMTA website until November.

Wyatt Burger will be the new Library Chair. He will be also working to create an archive of online links to past Eugene District OMTA Presentation recordings. Nick thanked Nobuko Lebeau for her work as past Library Chair.
