Recording Secretary's Report

Minutes of the May 12, 2008 District Meeting

After enjoying a delicious breakfast at the Original Pancake House, Carolyn McHan called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM. The April Minutes and Treasurer's Report were approved.

Announcements

Neil Patton has cancelled his recital.

Esther Megargel will be giving a Composition recital on June 3rd at 6 PM in Beall Hall. Sandy Hull showed some trophies that she uses for student awards. They're available at www.K2awards.com.

A Mary Kogan workshop, "Be the Teacher you Want to Be" will take place from June 17-19 at PSU. Cost is \$375. For more information or to register, contact Mary Kogen at rhythmmary@comcast.net.

Hosts are still needed for the International Chinese Summer camps. Contact Linda Hwang if you or your students can house a Chinese exchange student.

Vice-President Marti Csonka handed out a teacher survey. This is done biannually to foster communication among members regarding studio policies, fees and teaching tips. Please remember to fill out the questionnaire and mail it to her.

Event planning for 2008-2009

Barnes & Noble Fundraiser - The pros and cons of a Saturday vs. Sunday event were discussed. It was noted that it was preferable to have the student performances the first day of the week-long event rather than the last day. Dates were discussed and it was decided to hold the Barnes & Noble performances on Dec. 7th.

The Holiday recital will be Dec. 14 at the Wildish, NCC, or United Lutheran Church.

The theme for the Hult Center festival will be Romantic music. Please submit your ideas for a title to Carolyn McHan or Carol White. There was a discussion regarding pros and cons of the Wildish vs,. the hult Center as venues. It was noted that the sight lines at the Hult are not good. This could be remedied by renting a small stage for \$400. Claire Wachter suggested we find a special sponsor for the stage.

Teachers voted for the venue they preferred, Wildish or Hult. There were 11 votes for the Wildish and 2 for the Hult. The principal objection regarding the Hult is the visibility or performers. Most members agreed that it was desirable to use both venues over the course of the year. After discussing it, consensus was to use both and get the stage for the Hult.

Treasurer's annual report

Wyatt served up pie charts giving a colorful visual representation of our income and expenses for the year. See the breakdown and analysis in this issue of the *Con Brio*. He noted that our income is fragile and can vary greatly from year to year.

Public Relations/Fundraising

There was discussion regarding whether we are better served by the phone or by the web. Jane Lunstrom passed out a breakdown of referral sources that indicated that most referrals are coming from the Yellow Pages ad.

The Board voted to remove the bold type from the ad in the Yellow Page listing which can save us \$20/month. These funds can be allocated to do some enhancing with the web.

It was noted that the primary necessities for our web page are that, 1) it needs to be easier to get a hit by googling "piano teacher" and that, 2) our teachers would benefit from being able to fill out entry forms online before printing them. The group MSP a recommendation to hire J. Daniel Gonzalez, M.A. (Ellen's son) to do the work at a special rate of \$30/hr. (amount not to exceed \$300).
