November Meeting & Program

Our meeting on Monday, November 10 will be at Linda Spangler's studio at 2441 Emerald St. We will gather at 9 AM to greet colleagues and enjoy refreshments provided by Linda and Christy Matheson. An important business meeting will follow, with Carolyn McHan presiding.

Linda, the author of *Piano Freedom for Frustrated Pianists:* Finding Your Learning Style, will be talking about how to teach students with different learning styles. With eight of you sitting at electric keyboards, Linda will demonstrate how to help each of your students:

- Take in information on the combination of aural, visual, kinesthetic and analytic channels that suits his or her learning style.
- Discover the most effective way(s) to learn new music: playing by note, chord and/or ear.
- Find the appropriate balance between learning the underlying elements of music step-by-step and passionately plunging into songs.

Linda founded and directed the UO Senior Citizens Piano Program (1982-1992). After obtaining a research grant from the National Institute of Health, she designed a curriculum that incorporated off-keyboard exercises, then tested it with 100 seniors. For the past 17 years, she's been writing, testing and perfecting *Piano Freedom for Frustrated Pianists*, a companion book (*Piano Freedom Toolbox: Drills, Thrills and Memory Pegs*), a prequel (*The Joy of Piano*) and a sequel (*Welcome to Seventh Heaven*).

To find Linda's studio from downtown, take 18th Street past the UO School of Music. Two blocks past the light at University St., turn right on Emerald and go to 2441 Emerald. To find the studio, walk through the carport, into the backyard and up the ramp.
