Ensemble Festival

Our Eugene District Ensemble Festival took place on Sunday, November 9 at the School of Music of the University of Oregon, in Room 163. It was again a great musical celebration with devoted students and teachers. Seventy students registered, 15 teachers participated. Our adjudicator was Jean-David Coen. Our first recital was noncompetitive, the second and third were a mix of noncompetitive and competitive. Winners and alternates were chosen from the competitive portion of the programs. They were divided into three age-sections: Kindergarten to 5th grade, 6th to 8th grade, and 9th to 12th grade.

The K-5th age section winners were Hunter Ignatious, Joseph Yamaguchi, playing "turkey in the Straw," and American Folk Song arr. by Henry Holt. and "Fire Dance" by Timothy Brown, students of Irina Wilborn; Corina MacWilliams, Wesley Georgiev, Hugh MacWilliams, playing "Three to Get Ready" by Robert Vandall, students of Christine Mirabella. The 6th-8th grade section had no winners.

The 9th-12th age section winners were Mira Howard, Amber Ruck playing "Romance" from Six Pieces Op. 11 by Rachmaninoff, students of Lucy Clevenger; Grant Crider-Phillips, Alex Crider-Phillips, playing "Spanish Dance" Op. 12, No. 2 by Moritz Moskowski, students of Delores Tiktin; Hannah Larson, Malachi Marlan-Librett, Erik Barnes, Joseph Han, playing "Perpetual Commotion" by Kevin Olson, students of Christine Mirabella.

Alternates for this section were Pema Maretich, Katherine Rowland, playing Waltzes Op. 39, No. 2 and 5 by Brahms, students of Christine Mirbella; Joseph Han, Connor Hertzberg playing "Blues Nocturne" by Robert Vandall, students of Christine Mirabella; Chris Ren, Andrew Gao playing "Waltz" from Six Pieces Op. 11 by Rachmaninoff, students of Lucy Clevenger.

All the winning ensembles will perform at the State Ensemble Festival, in the Russell Tripp Performance Center in Takena Hall, LBCC, Albany, on December 5th and 6th.
