OMTA Composition Festival Deadline for submissions: February 17, 2012

I am delighted to announce that our adjudicator for the upcoming Composition Festival will be Simon Hutchinson.

Simon is a PhD candidate in composition at the University of Oregon, holding degrees from Bates College and the University of California, Santa Cruz. In addition to his academic education, Hutchinson spent several years in Japan studying shamisen (three-stringed lute) and Japanese Folk Music with virtuoso Sato Asao and shakuhachi (vertical bamboo flute) with Sato Chikuen. Now, drawing on experience from this diverse background, he composes unique works integrating music of different cultures and styles, exploring themes of nature, humanity, and global community.

Hutchinson's music has been performed across the US as well as in Japan, South Korea, and Portugal, including at various music festivals and conferences, such as the SEAMUS National Conference (2011, 2012), Miso Music Portugal (2010, 2011), the Music Today Festival (2011), April in Santa Cruz (2006, 2007), and the Oregon Bach Festival Composers Symposium (2009).
