I was born into a family of musicians in Kharkov, Ukraine. At the age of five, I began studying piano with my mother and within a year was accepted into the Kharkov Special Music School as a student of Professor Krivonos. In 1991, my family immigrated to Israel and after completing high school, I went on to study composition at the Rubin Academy in Jerusalem. I kept playing piano and in 2002, was accepted into the Juilliard School as a student of Yoheved Kaplinsky.

Within the first days of my arrival to the United States, I met Asya Kozhevnikova, who was also studying piano at Juilliard, and two years later we married. In May 2005, we both graduated with BM degrees and in June our first son, Pyotr, was born. In 2007 we moved to Bloomington, Indiana to continue our musical studies. In May of 2009, I received a MM degree from the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University where I studied with Professor Edward Auer. Currently, I am finishing my DMA program at the University of Oregon as a student of Alexandre Dossin.
